If exhibitor chooses to ride two state qualifying tests or the same state qualifying test twice, highest score will be used for state qualifying.

Things to consider as you decide which dressage tests to ride –

- At what dressage level (intro, training, first) are my horse and I currently performing? Generally, you should choose tests from that level.
- Am I interested in state qualifying and am I ready to ride a state qualifying test? If yes to both, choose at least one state qualifying test as specified above. You may choose to ride the state qualifying test twice.
- Am I qualified for Medals in dressage? Am I interested in having a dressage ride at fair be a Medal attempt? If so, choose at least one test appropriate for your Medal attempt.
 - Minimum test for Bronze is T-2 (61%), Minimum test for Silver is T-3 (62%), Minimum test for Gold is 1-1 (63%). Minimum test for Supreme is 1-3 or First Level Musical Freestyle (63%).
- Would I prefer to ride one test two times or two different tests on the same day? A caller can be used at our county event but not at State Fair.

Over Fences Division

Over Fences exhibitors must have pre-qualified prior to event (see rule book). Each Over Fences exhibitor may enter Intro Over Fences Division, Pre-Qualifying Over Fences Division, **or** Qualifying Over Fences Division.

No cross entry between divisions. Intro and pre-qualifying divisions are not state qualifying.

Intro Over Fences division (Cross rails 18" measured at the center of the 'x'). Two classes will be offered. First class is a hunter class to be judged primarily on the horse. This is considered a warm-up class; it will be judged and placed but no championship will be awarded. Second class is the equitation class.

Pre-Qualifying Over Fences division (Fences 2' to 2'3"): Two classes will be offered. First class is a hunter class to be judged primarily on the horse; fences to be set at 2'. This is considered a warm-up class; it will be judged and placed, but no championship will be awarded. Second class is the equitation class; fences to be set from 2' to 2'3".

Qualifying Over Fences division: Two classes will be offered. First class is a hunter class to be judged primarily on the horse; fences to be set from 2'3"- 2'6". This is considered a warm-up class; it will be judged and placed, but no championship will be awarded. Second class is the equitation class. This is the state qualifying class. Two fence heights will be offered: 2'3"-2'6" and 2'6"-2'9". Riders choose height to be jumped. All riders at the same 4-H age level will be judged together regardless of height selected.

Riders entering any OF division will automatically be entered into both classes offered. Qualifying division riders need to select height for equitation class. *Over Fences riders who are Medals qualified will automatically be entered into the appropriate Over Fences Medal class.*
