

Requirement Check List For King County Fair and State Fair Participation

- ✓ Each member must complete a Horse Certificate for the project horse they will be riding and turn it in to the Permanent Numbers Chair by April 1st. You can find it on the website under Forms.
- ✓ Horse Certificate on file by April 1st for Intermediates and Seniors to participate in the Medals program.
- ✓ Each member gets one number for each horse from the Permanent number chair, members print out their numbers.
- ✓ Be sure each member understands and has access to the rule books:
The King County Horse 4-H Rule Book, PNW Contest Guide and King County 4-H Medals Book, are under the Resources tab on the website.
- ✓ The deadline for fair enrollment paperwork to be turned in to the fair superintendent is the May leaders meeting
- ✓ Members will comply with the King County 4-H dress code.
- ✓ This form as well as the King County Code of Conduct will be signed by member and parent and turned in with enrollment paperwork.

Requirements for members to participate in the King County Fair

- ✓ Leader, or club representative, needs to attend 6 out of the 9 leaders meetings.
- ✓ Have direct control of their project horse by the May Leaders Meeting. Direct control means that they are caring for the horse and no trainers ride the horse after this date and all horses must be in record book.
- ✓ Horse Certificates must be turned in to the Permanent number chair by the May leaders meeting.
- ✓ Attend any 2 King County 4-H horse shows with their project horse.
- ✓ Participate in a Showmanship class with their project horse at 2 shows.
- ✓ Participate in a community service project or event.
- ✓ Perform a Public Presentation at the club level.
- ✓ Complete a Record Book and Permanent Record and turn it in by decoration day at fair.
- ✓ Participate in an equine Judging.
- ✓ Report for vet check at the assigned times for your section, and stay till your section is excused.

Requirements for members to be eligible to qualify for the State Fair

- ✓ Have direct control of their project horse by April 1st.
- ✓ It is the members responsibility to check that Horse certificates are checked off with the Permanent number chair by April 1st.
- ✓ Intermediates and Seniors only No Junior, Novice or Green Horse riders.
- ✓ Participate in Herdsmanship at the King County Fair.
- ✓ Participate in one of the following: Educational poster, Groom Squad Team, Horse Bowl or Hippology team, Equine Public Speaking, Public Presentation at the county level or on the judging state team.
- ✓ Sign, turn in and comply with the State Fair Code of Conduct.
- ✓ Attend any 2 King County 4-H horse shows with their project horse, compete in Showmanship at both.
- ✓ Receive a blue or red in showmanship by the end of King County Fair.
- ✓ Compete in each class at a KC 4-H show, and King County Fair, that you want to qualify in for the State Fair.
- ✓ Attend the King County fair with their project horse and participate in showmanship and at least 1 other state qualifying event in their section.
- ✓ Receive a satisfactory from their club leader based on their behavior and participation at the King County fair.
- ✓ If returning to state, receive a satisfactory from their Section Manager at the previous years State Fair.
- ✓ Member must attend the mandatory State Team Meeting.
- ✓ Report for vet check at the assigned times for your section and stay till your section is excused.
